It was used by the Japanese occupying forces as a seaplane base in 1941 and was reopened as a school under the Japanese in 1942.</b>	
<b>Description: V- shaped concrete structure with stone towers in the International Modern Style with Art Deco Influences. Varying number of floors on different sections. Older section has balconies across the front with entrances to classrooms etc. from the balconies. Flat roofs.</b>

The building was constructed of green bricks with cut granite door frame and corner blocks. The entrance door also contains a traditional sliding Tanglung sliding gate. Decorative features of the building include, geometric plaster mouldings, wall friezes and a highly decorative altar in the main hall</b></p>

<p><b>Description: Edwardian Classical Revival architectural style. It is a two storey building with arch style windows and render covered exterior walls painted pink. Other features include moulded string courses, column capitals, cornices and parapet walls.</b></p> <p><b>The building was originally constructed as two separate wings which housed living quarters.</b></p>

The annex buildings are all single storey and are built in a similar style to the main building but in a simpler style.</b>
