Public Consultation Programme On Charges for Sewage Services

On 20 September 1993, the Government announced the public charging scheme for sewage services. The two-month public consultation programme was concluded with a Motion Debate in the Legislative Council on 1 December 1993.

- 2. During the consultation period, the Government had briefed a wide range of groups and organisations, which included:
 - Environmental Pollution Advisory Committee (Renamed Advisory Council on the Environment with effect from 1 January 1994)
 - Environmental Affairs Panel of the Legislative Council
 - Individual Political Groups
 (Liberal Party, United Democrats of Hong Kong,
 Democratic Alliance for the Betterment of Hong Kong &
 Hong Kong Association for Democracy and People's
 Livelihood)
 - Industry and Technology Development Council
 - Major Industry And Commerce Organisations
 (Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce,
 Chinese Manufacturers Association
 American Chamber of Commerce &
 Beverage Manufacturers Association)
 - Green Groups
 - District Boards
 (Eastern, Kowloon City, Wong Tai Sin, Sai Kung, Kwun
 Tong, Kwai Tsing and Mongkok)
- 3. Since the announcement of the proposed charging scheme, we had received 80 written submissions, 57 from various organisations or companies and 23 from individual members of the public. There was a general support to the principle of charging.
- 4. In its Motion Debate on 1 December 1993, the Legislative Council also indicated majority support for the proposed charging scheme.
