<b>Key Initiatives</b>	<b>Targets</b>
<b>Territory-wide Source Separation of Domestic Waste</b>	<p>To increase the domestic waste recovery rate from 14% in 2004 to 20% in 2007 and 26% in 2012.</p> <p>To increase the number of housing estates under the programme to 180, 700, 1,140 and 1,360 by the end of 2005, 2007, 2009 and 2010 respectively, so as to enlist 80% of the local population by 2010.</p> <p>To increase the number of public rental housing (PRH) estates taking part, from 30 in 2005 to all PRH estates by 2012.</p>
<b>PRSs</b>  PRS for specific products <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Electrical &amp; electronic equipment</li> <li>- Vehicle tyres</li> <li>- Plastic bags</li> <li>- Packaging materials</li> <li>- Beverage containers</li> <li>- Rechargeable batteries</li> </ul>	<p>To introduce the Product Eco-responsibility Bill into the LegCo in 2006.</p> <p>} To introduce Regulations in 2007.</p> <p>} To introduce Regulations in 2008.</p> <p>To introduce Regulation in 2009.</p>
<b>MSW Charging</b>	To introduce relevant legislation into the LegCo in 2007.
<b>Land Policy</b>	To provide short-term tenancy sites with longer duration for the recycling industry on a case-by-case basis.
<b>EcoPark</b>	To commission Phase 1 by late 2006 and Phase 2 by 2009.
<b>Green Procurement</b>	Government departments to adopt a green procurement policy as far as practicable.
<b>Funding for Recycling Technology Projects</b>	On-going.
<b>Landfill Disposal Bans</b>	To tie in with PRS and IWMF programmes.
<b>Integrated Waste Management Facilities</b>	To commission the IWMF in mid 2010's subject to the implementation of the “polluter-pays” principle.
<b>Landfill Extensions</b>	To commission these extensions in early to mid 2010's.
