Fourth Review on the 1989 White Paper on the Environment

Introduction

This paper seeks Members' views on a proposal for the Fourth White Paper Review on the Environment, due to be published by the end of 1997.

Background

- 2. When the 1989 White Paper Pollution in Hong Kong A Time to Act was published, the Governor in Council ordered that a review of progress on the many initiatives in the White Paper should be published every two years. The first review appeared in 1991, the second in 1993 and the third in early 1996.
- 3. The thrust of the Third Review, which was subtitled "Heading towards Sustainability" placed particular emphasis on sustainable development and its incorporation into decisions which have an impact on the environment.

The Fourth Review

4. The approach to the Fourth Review, as set out in the draft outline attached, envisages building on the messages in the Third Review with particular emphasis on planning against pollution. Developing sustainable development programmes will continue to be the main focus.

Advice Sought

- 5. Members are asked to advise
 - a) Whether they support the proposed structure of the Fourth White Paper Review, as set out in the draft outline;
 - b) What areas they consider should be developed; and

- c) How the public could be involved in the formulation and implementation of sustainable development strategies.
- 6. Subject to Members' views, Planning, Environment and Lands Branch will consult the Green Groups and the Legislative Council Environmental Affairs Panel on the draft outline. Members will be briefed on the outcome of these discussions and consulted on a draft of the Fourth White Paper Review before it is submitted to the Executive Council.
