<p>Historical Appraisal:</p> <p>Literature review identified limited information regarding the history of Wo Hop Shek village. Review of the 1688 and 1819 editions of the Xin'an Gazetteer and the Volonteri Map of Xin'an County 1866 identified that Wo Hop Shek village was not recorded. According to the list of villages recorded in the block lease, the village was resited from Shing Mum in Tsuen Wan in 1929. Only a few buildings remain the original traditional style.</p>

<p>Historical Appraisal:</p> <p>Siu Hang Tsuen is the youngest village of the Five Wais (walled villages) and Six Tsuens (villages) (五圍六村) of the Tang clan in Lung Yeuk Tau (龍躍頭) who first settled in the area in the 14th century. The Tangs in the village were originated from Lo Wai (老圍) whose 14th generation ancestors moved to Longtang (龍堂) of Shenzhen due to inadequate living space. Harassed by bandits frequently, the 20th generation ancestors moved back to Lung Yeuk Tau. They purchased land and built two rows of 12 houses in the village among some other non-Tang families.</p>
