Condition of Approval under Section 8(3) of the EIA Ordinance

(1) The Project Proponent shall devise detailed Compensatory Tree Planting Implementation Plans (the Plans) to compensate the loss of 0.25 ha of woodland within the Lion Rock Country Park (LRCP) in a ratio of no less than 1:1 in terms of area and to compensate the tree loss under the Project in a ratio of no less than 1:1 in terms of number. The Plans shall include planting objectives, planting details including numbers, locations and areas, as well as arrangement and responsibility of maintenance and monitoring of the proposed planting. The Project Proponent shall consult the Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation and relevant authority on the Plans prior to submission to the Director of Environmental Protection for approval before the commencement of compensatory tree planting.

Recommendations from the Advisory Council on the Environment for Carrying Out of the Project

The Project Proponent is recommended to -

- (1) explore the possibility to provide compensation for the permanent loss of 0.16 ha of woodland within the LRCP, in liaison with the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD), as far as practicable;
- (2) adopt appropriate, innovative, environmental-friendly and bird-friendly noise mitigation measures, including but not limited to the provision of noise barriers and enclosures, to mitigate the road traffic noise impacts arising from the Project. A community liaison group should be set up for maintaining regular communication with the relevant stakeholders with a view to achieving consensus on the design of the noise barriers/enclosures in terms of colour, material and dimension taking into account their landscape and visual impacts;
- in case of any wild animal nuisance arising from the Project, propose and implement appropriate management and remedial measures, in consultation with the AFCD;
- (4) explore ways to shorten the construction time with a view to minimising the disturbances and nuisances to the neighbouring residents as far as practicable; and
- (5) minimise the generation of construction and demolition (C&D) materials as well as reuse and recycle the C&D materials and yard waste (e.g. felled trees) on site or in other projects.
