Dear Victor,

In the EIA report review, EPD advised that (Please refer to comment no.3 as highlighted below) we should seek CAD and GFS comments on adjacent buildings height and restriction as stipulated by OZP/ Town Planning Board. There are two items that we would like to draw your attention:

Octa Tower: The existing Octa Tower was built at +136.45mPD from the record that we were able to retrieve, despite under OZP the building height limit was at +100mPD. That would make it 17.3m higher than the design level of the NAH helipad at +119.15mPD. However, the building is located outside the flight sector previously confirmed and on a stepped profile with the higher portion of the roof located further away from the flight sector.

 Kerry DG Warehouse: There is a review currently under way in PlanD for a commercial development project at the location of the Kerry DG Warehouse which potentially would create a building up to +110mPD. But again despite it's outside the flight sector we should let GFS aware of this and comment.

We are sending over the attached diagram for better illustration. Grateful if you can review and get back to us if there are any comments so we can move on with EPD. Please feel free to call if there are any questions. Thanks.

A Rooftop Helipad at New Acute Hospital at Kai Tak Development Area

We (Meinhardt Infrastructure and Environment Limited (MIEL)) have been appointed to carry out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Study for the captioned project (the Project) proposed by the Hospital Authority (HA). The corresponding EIA Study Brief No. ESB-311/2019 was issued by Environmental Protection Department (EPD) on 19 February 2019.

As part of the EIA study, we need to identify the Noise Sensitive Receivers (NSRs) in vicinity of the Project. According to Annex 13 of the Technical Memorandum on Environmental Impact Assessment Process (TM-EIAO), the potential noise sensitive receivers could be, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Residential Uses (all domestic premises including temporary housing)
- b. Institutional Uses (educational institutions including kindergarten and nurseries, hospitals, medical clinics, homes for the

aged, convalescent homes, places of public worship, libraries, courts of law, performing arts centres, auditoria, amphitheatres) c. Others (hostels, country parks)

It is noted that the Kai Tak Fire Station is located within 300m from the Project. Based on the layout plan as shown in the attached Public Works Subcommittee (Papers) No. PWSC(2011-12)27, as well as our on-site observation, we conclude that the Fire Services Standby Quarters, Officers' Standby Quarters, Female Standby Quarters, Ambulance Standby Quarters, General Office and Lecture Room of the Kai Tak Fire Station are equipped with central air conditioning system and not rely on opened windows for ventilation, in accordance with TM-EIAO. We would be grateful if you could confirm us whether our view is accepted by your department.
