**Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Ordinance, Cap. 499
Project Title: Revitalisation of Fo Tan Nullah**

Confirmation pursuant to Clause 6.2 of EIA Study Brief
(EIA study brief No.: ESB-319/2019)

We refer to your email dated 9 February 2022 seeking our confirmation on whether the scope of issues covered by the subject EIA study brief can still cover the key changes in the scope of the Project pursuant to its Clause 6.2, as extracted below:

“6.2 If there is any key change in the scope of the Project mentioned in Section 1.2 of this EIA study brief and in Project Profile (No. PP-585/2019), the Applicant must seek confirmation from the Director in writing on whether or not the scope of issues covered by this EIA study brief can still cover the key changes, and the additional issues, if any, that the EIA study must also address. If the changes to the Project fundamentally alter the key scope of the EIA study brief, the Applicant shall apply to the Director for a fresh EIA study brief.”

Based on the information provided, we understand that the key changes in the scope of the Project include (i) exclusion of “Improvement/modification of drainage channel connecting Kwai Tei Street” from the Project; and (ii) addition of an underground water storage tank (10m wide, 30m length and 2.5m depth) under the existing Kwai Tei Street Garden to the Project.

Having considered your reported changes, the associated potential environmental impacts, the original project scope, and assessment requirements of the captioned EIA study brief, we consider that the proposed changes to the Project would not fundamentally alter the key scope of issues covered by the captioned EIA study brief. Hence, your department may not need to apply for a fresh EIA study brief.

We wish to remind you that the above advice is valid based on the information provided in your email of 9 February 2022. If there are any further key changes in the Project details and scope during the course of EIA study, you shall continue to observe the requirement of clause 6.2 of the EIA study brief and seek our confirmation in writing.


According to the information provided, the proposed change is the addition of a set of water circulation pumps and pipes connecting to the underground storage tank under the existing Kwei Tei Street Garden.
