**Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Ordinance, Cap. 499,  
Project Title: Revitalisation of Tai Wai Nullah**

**Confirmation pursuant to Clause 6.2 of EIA Study Brief**  
(EIA Study Brief No. ESB-320/2019)

I refer to your e-mail dated 4 November 2022 seeking our confirmation on whether the scope of issues covered by the subject EIA study brief can still cover the proposed change in the scope of the Project pursuant to its Clause 6.2, as extracted below:


*“6.2 If there is any key change in the scope of the Project mentioned in Section 1.2 of this EIA study brief and in Project Profile (No. PP-586/2019), the Applicant must seek confirmation from the Director in writing on whether or not the scope of issues covered by this EIA study brief can still cover the key changes, and the additional issues, if any, that the EIA study must also address. If the changes to the Project fundamentally alter the key scope of the EIA study brief, the Applicant shall apply to the Director for a fresh EIA study brief.”*

According to the information provided, the proposed changes include the addition of two underground water pumps and pipes connecting to upstream stilling basin for water recirculation and a UV disinfection system for water treatment as well as minor changes to the Project boundary.

Having considered your reported change, the associated potential environmental impacts, the original project scope, and assessment requirements of the captioned EIA study brief, we consider that the proposed changes to the Project would not fundamentally alter the key scope of issues covered by the captioned EIA study brief. Hence, your department may not need to apply for a fresh EIA study brief.

We wish to remind you that the above advice is valid based on the information provided in your e-mail of 4 November 2022. If there are any further key changes in the Project details and scope during the course of EIA study, you shall continue to observe the requirement of clause 6.2 of the EIA study brief and seek our confirmation in writing.
