Legislation	Affected Product Categories
Federal Energy Efficiency Laws – specific minimum energy efficiency and require certain appliances to fulfill certain minimum energy efficiency standards and to display energy efficiency information.	Electrical appliances
Battery Act – bans mercury batteries; requires labelling and recycling of rechargeable batteries.	Rechargeable batteries
State electronic waste legislation and mandatory electronics take-back programme – require manufacturers to pay an advanced recovery fee for financing state recovery programmes, and/or to set up systems for take-back and disposal of end-of-life products.	Consumer electronics
Federation Trade Commission Act (FTC Act) – prohibits unfair or deceptive acts or practices to environmental marketing claims.	All products





- Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive (Directive 2002/96/EC)
- Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive (RoHS) (Directive 2002/95/EC)
- Directive 2000/55/EC on energy efficiency requirements for ballast for fluorescent lighting
- Directive 96/57/EC on energy efficiency requirements for household electric refrigerators, freezers and combination thereof
- Packaging Directive (Directive 94/62/EC)
- Energy Labelling Directive (Directive 92/75/EEC)
- Batteries Directive (Directives 91/157/ECC and 98/101/EC) and Battery Marking Directive (Directive 93/86/EEC)
- Directive 86/594/ECC on airborne noise emitted by household appliances



- Home Appliance Recycling Law (formally known as the Law for Recycling of Specified Kinds of Home Appliances)
- Energy Conservation Law (formally known as the Law Concerning the Rational Use of Energy)
