To whom it may concern,

On Saturday, 6 November, at approximately 5:35 p.m., our Turbojet ferry from Macau was docking at the Macau Ferry Terminal on Hong Kong Island. Imagine my disgust when I saw a person on board the Turbojet "Shun Tak #3" tugboat, which was moored to the side of the terminal, purposely dump rubbish into the harbour by leaning over the water and shaking out the contents of a rubbish container. The rubbish consisted of plastic bags and bottles. This person, wearing a blue shirt, appeared to be the only person on board the tugboat, and appeared very much at home there, so I assume he had a right to be there and is an employee of Turbojet.

His behaviour was not only totally thoughtless about the environment, but probably illegal as well. I will act as a witness to this event if I am asked to by law enforcement officials. It is small acts like this, which if multiplied, lead to the complete environmental degradation of our waters.
